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this work is a revealing chronicle of hip hop culture from its beginnings three decades ago to the present with an analysis of its influence on people and popular culture in the united states and around the world from grandmaster flash and the furious five s the message to jay z diddy and 50 cent hip hop culture is the first comprehensive reference work to focus on one of the most influential cultural phenomena of our time scholarly and streetwise backed by statistics documents and research it recounts three decades of hip hop s evolution highlighting its defining events recordings personalities movements and ideas as well as society s response how did an inner city subculture all but dismissed in the early 1980s become the ruler of the world s airwaves and ipods who are the players who moved hip hop from the record bins to the pinnacles of entertainment business and fashion who are the founders innovators legends and major players authoritative and authentic hip hop culture provides a wealth of information and insights for students educators and anyone interested in the ways pop culture reflects and shapes our lives

throughout the 1950s and 1960s the black church stood as the stronghold of the black community fighting for equality and economic self sufficiency and challenging its body to be self determined and self aware hip hop culture grew from disenfranchised urban youth who felt that they had no support system or resources impassioned with the same urgent desires for survival and hope that their parents and grandparents had carried these youth forged their way from the bottom of america s belly one rhyme at a time for many young people hip hop culture is a supplement or even an alternative to the weekly dose of sunday morning faith in this collection of provocative essays leading thinkers

preachers and scholars from around the country confront both the black church and the hip hop generation to realize their shared responsibilities to one another and the greater society arranged into three sections this volume addresses key issues in the debate between two of the most significant institutions of black culture the first part from civil rights to hip hop explores the transition from one generation to another through the transmission or lack thereof of legacy and heritage part ii hip hop culture and the black church in dialogue explores the numerous ways in which the conversation is already occurring from sermons to theoretical examinations and spiritual ponderings part iii gospel rap holy hip hop and the hip hop matrix clarifies the perspectives and insights of practitioners scholars and activists who explore various expressions of faith and the diversity of locations where these expressions take place in the black church and hip hop culture pastors ministers theologians educators and laypersons wrestle with the duties of providing timely commentary critical analysis and in some cases practical strategies toward forgiveness healing restoration and reconciliation with inspiring reflections and empowering discourse this collection demonstrates why and how the black church must re engage in the lives of those who comprise the hip hop generation

performing identity performing culture hip hop as text pedagogy and lived practice is the first book length ethnography of young people and their uses of hip hop culture originally published in 2001 this second edition is newly revised expanded and updated to reflect contemporary currents in hip hop culture and critical scholarship as well as the epochal social cultural and economic shifts of the last decade drawing together historical work on hip hop and rap music as well as four years of research at a local community center greg dimitriadis argues here

that contemporary youth are fashioning notions of self and community outside of school in ways educators have largely ignored his studies are broad ranging how two teenagers constructed notions of a southern tradition through their use of southern rap artists like eightball mjjg and three 6 mafia how young people constructed notions of history through viewing the film panther a film they connected to hip hop culture more broadly and how young people dealt with the life and death of hip hop icon tupac shakur constructing resurrection myths that still resonate and circulate today

essays examining the impact of hip hop music on pop culture and youth identity in post soviet central and eastern europe responding to the development of a lively hip hop culture in central and eastern european countries this interdisciplinary study demonstrates how a universal model of hip hop serves as a contextually situated platform of cultural exchange and becomes locally inflected after the soviet union fell hip hop became popular in urban environments in the region but it has often been stigmatized as inauthentic due to an apparent lack of connection to african american historical roots and black identity originally strongly influenced by aesthetics from the united states hip hop in central and eastern europe has gradually developed unique local trajectories a number of which are showcased in this volume on the one hand hip hop functions as a marker of western cosmopolitanism and democratic ideology but as the contributors show it is also a malleable genre that has been infused with so much local identity that it has lost most of its previous associations with the west in the experiences of local musicians audiences and producers contextualizing hip hop through the prism of local experiences and regional musical expressions these valuable case studies reveal the broad spectrum of its impact on popular culture and youth identity in the post soviet world the volume represents a valuable

and timely contribution to the study of popular culture in central and eastern europe hip hop at europe s edge will not only appeal to readers interested in contemporary popular culture in central and eastern europe but also inspire future research on post socialism s unique local adaptations of global cultural trends the soviet and post soviet review the authors of this edited volume do not romanticize and heroize the genre by automatically equating it with political opposition a fate often suffered by rock before instead the book has to be given much credit for presenting a very nuanced picture of hip hop s entanglement or non entanglement for that matter with politics in this wide stretch of the world past and present the russian review

hip hop s inheritance arguably offers the first book length treatment of what hip hop culture has literally inherited from the harlem renaissance the black arts movement the feminist art movement and 1980s and 1990s postmodern aesthetics by comparing and contrasting the major motifs of the aforementioned cultural aesthetic traditions with those of hip hop culture all the while critically exploring the origins and evolution of black popular culture from antebellum america through to obama s america hip hop s inheritance demonstrates that the hip hop generation is

not the first generation of young black and white folk preoccupied with spirituality and sexuality race and religion entertainment and athletics or ghetto culture and bourgeois culture taking interdisciplinarity and intersectionality seriously hip hop s inheritance employs the epistemologies and methodologies from a wide range of academic and organic intellectual activist communities in its efforts to advance an intellectual history and critical theory of hip hop culture drawing from academic and organic intellectual activist communities as diverse as african american studies and women s studies postcolonial studies and sexuality studies history and philosophy politics and economics and sociology and ethnomusicology hip hop s inheritance calls into question one dimensional and monodisciplinary interpretations or rather misinterpretations of a multidimensional and multivalent form of popular culture that has increasingly come to include cultural criticism social commentary and political analysis

sociologist s craig watkins shows how the black film wave has transformed the concept and representation of blackness in america watkins contends that despite the social and economic marginalization of black youth they have gained unprecedented access to the popular media and have influenced not only black popular culture but the broader u s popular culture scene as well

american studies course transnational american culture studies language english abstract 1 introduction in the following study the relationship and interaction between hip hop and the media in the usa will be discussed the aim of this paper is to put hip hop into a wider framework of media and culture hip hop has triumphantly emerged from the underground to take its place in the mainstream of popular culture it is clear that the pervasive influence of hip hop extends to television film advertising fashion the print media and language itself although it has taken almost twenty years to reach this level of mass exposure the movement now stands as a multimillion dollar enterprise and a dominant cultural force that continues to grow to put it quite bluntly hip hop cannot be considered as an independent entity on its own it has to be explained in a broader context a creation out of a reaction with and against existing conventions hip hop must be reinvented from moment to moment centered around the impossibility of closure the moment it becomes identifiable its modes reducible it dies but hip hop s ability is to reinvent

itself continually hip hop is as potter puts it a cultural recycling center a social heterolect a field of contest even a form of psychological warfare 109 this paper tries to shed light on the following questions what is the media s influence on the history and development of hip hop culture how are the different rap categories treated by the media why is authenticity especially appealing to a white audience and consequently to the major spending power in how far are violence drugs and misogyny important for the development of hip hop culture how is the media coping with these issues the latter question leads to the next one why is rap as a part of hip hop the subject of a permanent call for censorship to answer this question some examples will be illustrated

ranging across the rap spectrum from the conscious hip hop of mos def to the gangsta rap of 50 cent to the underground sounds of jay-z and the roots he tracks the ongoing quest for a unique and credible voice to show how complex contested and malleable these codes of authenticity are most important ogburn persuasively challenges widely held notions that hip hop is socially dangerous to black youths in particular by addressing the ways in which rappers critically view the popularity of crime focused lyrics the antisocial messages of their peers and the volatile politics of the word nigga hip hop revolution deftly balances an insider's love of the culture with a scholar's detached critique exploring popular myths about black educational attainment civic engagement crime and sexuality by cutting to the bone of a lifestyle that many outsiders find threatening ogburn makes hip hop realer than it's ever been before
